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Description of the Undergraduate and Graduate Degrees granted by the Faculty of Arts

Units of study

A credit-weighting is applied to each unit of study. Full-time students normally take 20 credit points in a full academic year consisting of two semesters. The following units of study are available:

Undergraduate level

Semester unit ("semesteremne"), one semester/10 credit points
Foundation subject ("grunnfag"), two semesters/20 credit points
Intermediate subject ("mellomfag"), three semesters, 30 credit points
Major subject ("storfag"), four semesters, 40 credit points

Graduate level

Main subject ("hovedfag"), four semesters, 40 credit points (including thesis and course work)

Translation into ECTS credits

1 credit point is equivalent to 3 ECTS credits.

General comments

One study unit may be integrated in another study unit in the same subject on a higher level. A semester unit may, for instance, be integrated in a foundation subject or an intermediate subject, or a foundation subject may be integrated in an intermediate subject, etc.

Some 5-credit-point units may be integrated in subjects at both the graduate and the undergraduate level. These units cannot normally be included in the degree as independent study units, i.e. they can only be included in the degree if they are integrated in one of the larger units of study available.

Requirements for the Cand. Mag. Degree (Candidata/Candidatus Magisterii) in the Faculty of Arts

The *Cand. Mag. Degree* is modular in structure and is based on the accumulation of study units. In order to obtain the Cand. Mag. Degree, the student is required to complete subjects and units equal to 80 credit points. The degree includes Examen Philosophicum and Examen Facultatum¹, taken in the first semester, and a combination of two, three or four subjects and units taken consecutively. One of the subjects must be an Intermediate (30 credits) or a Major subject (40 credits) and one other subject at least a Foundation subject (20 credits).

The Cand. Mag. Degree in International Studies (the "IKS" Degree) has special requirements and is built up with a language subject, a non-language subject and an Area Studies foundation subject.

The Cand. Mag. Degree normally requires four years of full-time study at the Undergraduate level.

Requirements for the Cand. Philol. Degree (Candidata/Candidatus Philology)

In order to obtain the graduate level *Cand. Philol. Degree*, students are required to complete a Main Subject (40 credit points) and must previously have obtained a Cand. Mag. Degree (or the equivalent). The Main subject is an extension of an Intermediate or Major subject and consists of graduate courses and a thesis, which is generally estimated to one year's workload.

The Cand. Philol. Degree normally requires six years of full-time study (120 credit points).

Marking system

An overall mark is awarded for each subject and unit that has been satisfactorily completed. No overall mark is awarded for the degree as such.

The following grading system is used:

- 1.0 - 1.5 laudabilis prae ceteris
- 1.6 - 2.5 laudabilis
- 2.6 - 3.2 haud illaudabilis
- 3.3 - 4.0 non contemnendus
- 4.1 - 6.0 immaturus

Some subjects and units use a simplified pass/fail scale.

The upper part of the scale (1.0- 1-5) is rarely used. Thus, excellent performances are considered to be in the range of 1.6 - 1.9. The average mark for most foundation subjects at the Faculty of Arts is 2.5.

¹ Until the end of the Spring semester 1996, Examen Philosophicum at the University of Oslo required one semester of full time study, counting as the equivalent of 10 credit points in the Cand. Mag. Degree. From the Autumn semester 1996 onwards, Examen Philosophicum has been scaled down to 5 credit points and must be combined with Examen Facultatum in order to earn the required 10 credit points.
